EMPIRE DAY CELEBRATIONS

UGANDA POLICE.

24th May, 1932.

Empire Day Celebrations this year will be held at Mengo as under:-

8.00 a.m. Service at Nsambya.

9.30 a.m. Ceremony in the Lukiko Hall at Mengo

10.00 a.m. Saluting of the Flag at Mengo.

11.15 a.m. Service at Namirembe Cathedral.

1. An Armed party of the Uganda Police, 50 Rank and File, under an Officer, will parade in Review Order at 9.30 a.m. on 24th May, 1932 at Mengo, taking up position in front of the Flag.

2. His Excellency the Acting Governor will arrive at 10 a.m., and will be received by the Police with the Royal Salute, the Band of the King's African Rifles playing "The King".

3. The children will then be marched past the Flag (King's African Rifles' Band playing a March), and take up positions forming three sides of a square, behind and on both flanks of the Police detachment, which will be facing the Flag.

4. When the children are in position the speeches will be given.

5. On completion of the speeches the Police will salute the Flag "presenting arms", the King's African Rifles' Band playing "God Save the King", which ends the ceremony. His Excellency then leaves the ground.

6. The King's African Rifles and the Police will then leave the Ground, marching off to their own Band.

7. The Boy Scouts, Girl Guides and School parties will then march away under their own commanders or supervisors.

8. POLICE SCHOOL. The School Master will be responsible for parading the Police School Children as taking them into the position allotted to them on the ground. They are to be dressed in their school uniform. A responsible Non-Commissioned Officer in Uniform will take charge of the Police School Children's party and accompany them to and from the ground.

9. Traffic control and parking of vehicles will at all points in connection with the Ceremony be arranged for by the Superintendent of Police, Buganda Province.

10. A Committee to arrange the allotment of places to Boy Scouts and School Children's organization on the ground, the erection of the Flagstaff and the formation of the enclosure with posts and ropes, and other matters incidental thereto, is constituted as under :-
